



Future of Media and Communications Forum Challenges of Reality... and Bets of the Future





## **Background:**

Center for Defending Freedom of Journalists (CDFJ) is organizing the "Future of Media and Communication" Forum, in light of the changes that the media is witnessing. The media that people have known in the past decades is facing crises, its role is declining, and there are those who believe that it is on its way to decline.

Between the challenges of reality and the bets of the future; the Forum seeks to imagine and predict the forms and tools of media and communication after a decade or more, and whether social media platforms, such as: Facebook, X (formerly Twitter), Instagram, TikTok, and others, will still dominate the scene and control the audience, and advancing as a source for the flow of information, including fake and misleading information, or is there something coming after social media, and will it be a new revolution that will change the whole scene.

The forum will raise questions and seek answers, perhaps foremost among them: What is the fate of the professional media (newspapers, magazines, radio, television, websites) after sales, advertising, and even state support for them has declined? Is it breathing its last breath, or is it able to renew itself and withstand?

Social media platforms have become the main source for the flow of information, and have become the public's preferred source for obtaining information, as well as the preferred platforms for social media influencers who are attracting the attention of millions of social media users.





# **Background:**

Many facts have changed after the era of "social media," including that the media is no longer monopolized, states are no longer able to control content, and anyone can now have a platform to address and outreach people.

The debate is wide, and has not been resolved. There are different perceptions and approaches in examining media and communication in the future. The Forum will be an incubator and laboratory for discussing concerns and many questions, including:

- Identifying the challenges facing professional media, its sustainability, and its ability to reach the public.
- Proposing economic models that contribute to the sustainability of professional media and its response to the requirements of technological changes and audience trends.
- Highlighting success stories and models that enhance media independence and maintain its professionalism and sustainability.
- Discussing ideas and proposals to reduce harmful content, hate speech, and the promotion of violence through the media and social media platforms.
- Discussing the role of the state and civil society organizations in supporting the continued development of media that serves the public, and sustainable development.
- The best mechanisms for integrating social media platforms into media work.
- Mechanisms to protect freedom of expression and media in its various forms, and to confront misleading and fake news.
- Research communication mechanisms and the role of governments and communication companies.
- Using social media in awareness and advocacy campaigns.
- Soft power strategies and the role of social media platforms in them.
- Change in media and communication methodology on social media.
- Presenting pioneering Arab and international experiences in employing media and communication on social media platforms.
- The role of content creation companies in changing the pattern of communication strategies for companies and governments.





# **Center for Defending Freedom of Journalists:**

Center for Defending Freedom of Journalists (CDFJ) is a civil society organization founded in 1998 in Jordan, and has worked in the Arab world, and seeks to develop media and communication to play a role in sustainable development.

CDFJ was also licensed in Geneva/Switzerland in 2018, and registered as a branch of a foreign organization in Tunisia. It has regional and international partnerships, and its policies and directions are supervised by a Board of Directors that includes prominent public figures.

In August 2023, the United Nations granted CDFJ advisory membership in the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) in recognition of its status and role as a civil society organization that has been working for 25 years in supporting the development and protection of the media, defending human rights, and promoting sustainable development.

For 25 years, CDFJ has organized dozens of regional and international conferences and forums, including: Media and Satellite Channels in Arab Society, Media and Democracy, Media and Good Governance, Parliamentary Media Forum, Media Reform Forum, and Media Freedom Defenders Forum between the years 2012 and 2014, and succeeded in hosting the International Press Institute (IPI) conference in 2013 under the patronage of His Majesty King Abdullah II bin Al Hussein. CDFJ held also a conference on the challenges of Arab media in The Hague 2009 at the headquarters of the Dutch Parliament in partnership with the Dutch Free Voice Foundation.


